## **TOTAL TEEN EXPLORERS**




This summer has been full of exciting and inspiring opportunities for our teens as they've taken part in weekly college and career exploration trips designed to open doors and spark new interests.


These hands-on experiences continue to build confidence, teamwork, and connection to the natural world around our teen members.






# NEED HELP WITH GROCERIES? YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR SNAP BENEFITS

The Club encourages all individuals (18+) and families to reach out about the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and to find out if you are eligible.

#### **IMPORTANT SNAP MESSAGE 7/14/25:**

Hello, Families of Boys & Girls Clubs of Newport County,

This past weekend, our state suffered some widespread power outages, and the RI DHS wants to support those families who are enrolled in SNAP to request some replacement food assistance, but you need to act fast because it needs to be reported to DHS within 10 days of the power outage that resulted in the loss of food.

More specifically, in Rhode Island, <u>SNAP</u> (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) recipients experiencing food loss due to a power outage lasting four or more hours may be eligible for replacement benefits. To be considered, they must report the food loss to the <u>RI Department of Human Services (DHS)</u> within 10 days. Additionally, they need to submit a completed <u>SNAP-55 form</u> (Request for Replacement of Food Purchased with SNAP Benefits) within 10 days of reporting the loss. The SNAP-55 form can be found on the DHS website. If you need help with filing this form or have any questions around SNAP in general, please contact our Family Services Coordinator, Charlene Traynum ctraynum@bgcnewport.org or 401-847-6927, Ext. 156 today!

#### DO YOU NEED CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE?
